

# THE COST OF CLEAN CLOTHES IS RISING

HarborWalk's laundry vendor will be raising the cost of a wash and dry by \$0.25. Over the last 10 years the cost to do your laundry has gone up 31% where many other household items like eggs, gasoline, and bottled water have gone up from 85% to 447%

## **HELP OUR PIPES**

The sewer lines, especially at the north end of HarborWalk, are a little temperamental. Flushing baby wipes, tissues, tampons, diaper, and other materials, not meant for the sewer, stops them up. Please do not flush medicine down the toilet either. It can kill off good bacteria used to treat the sewage, not to mention what it does to the fish.

#### HELP YOUR PIPES

Periodically we see water damage to units and their neighbors because of a broken water supply line or angle stop. Angle stops are the little valves that come out of the wall and allow you to turn off the water to your toilet or sink. The water supply line is the flexible pipe running from the angle stop to the faucet or toilet. If either of these pieces fails and you are not around, it's a mess. VIP plumbing (used to be Victor's Plumbing), will replace all of your angle stops for between \$150 and \$300 depending on how many bathrooms you have and whether you have laundry hook-ups.

If you decide to replace your water supply lines, you might want to consider hoses that shut off automatically if they spring a leak. They are very little extra and work great everywhere except washing machines. One such product is called FloodSafe.
