

BEACON RANT

CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTORS

Last year, a new law went into affect requiring the installation of carbon monoxide detectors. Condominiums and townhouses were exempt for the first year. If you have a unit that has any type of natural gas, propane, or kerosene appliance (heater, stove, clothes dryer, water heater, or fireplace), or if you have an attached garage with a door that opens into the unit, you are required to install a detector on each level of your unit.

POOL RULES

November 4th we will shift to our winter Pool schedule. Pool and spa #1 will remain open and heated, Pool #2 will remain open but only the spa heated, and Pools #3 & #4 will be closed.

There is also a new Health Department code that must be posted on all Pool doors warning not to use the Pool or spa if you have had intestinal problems in the last two weeks.

Please keep the following rules in mind as you enjoy the Pool areas:

- Hours 8:00 AM to 10:00 PM
- Children under 14 must be accompanied by an adult at all times
- Children under 8 are not allowed in a spa
- Children 8-14 may not be in a spa without their parent
- No children in diapers in a pool or spa
- Beverages in unbreakable containers only, no food. Please clean up after yourself
- NO PETS in pool area
- Gates must be kept closed and locked at all times
- No more then four guest per unit, owners/tenants are responsible for their conduct
- No radios/mp3 players, etc
- Please follow the rules posted
- And of course, there is no lifeguard on duty so please be careful

CEASE THE GREASE

The City of Oxnard reminds us that cooking grease poured down the drain clogs the pipes in your home and city sewers. Clogged sewer lines cause sewage back-ups into our homes and may cause sewage to be released into city waterways, harming water quality and the environment.

- Don't pour oil or grease down the drain
- Don't wash cooking oil or grease from cookware down the drain
- Don't wash food scraps down the drain
- Do place cooled cooking oil or grease and fat in sealed containers and discard with your trash
- Do dry wipe oil and grease off of dishes and pans with a paper towel before washing
- Do scrape food scraps from dishes into the trash

- * Anything that would put someone in danger


Locking yourself out of your unit is not an emergency. If the office is open, they might be able to help you if you have provided a key. After hours call a locksmith.
