Mr. Salazar brings humor and insights from twenty-five years of experience in bringing back the traditional Chumash canoe culture to a tale sure to delight readers.

The sunset pictures in the Beacon have been taken over the last 17 years at Hollywood Beach. Each one reflects a sunset during the month the Beacon is published. This one is from January 2006. You can tell the time of year by where the Sun sets with respect to the Santa Cruz Island and Point Conception. The same tilt of the Earth that gives us our seasons causes the Sun to set over Santa Cruz Island during the winter months and closer to Point Conception during the summer months
